Different Ways of Integration

## PROJECT SUMMARY

Immigrants are groups of people particularly vulnerable to social exclusion due to barriers resulting from cultural and linguistic differences and difficulties in adaptation in the hosting society.

The social inclusion of these people through integration is a two-way activity because it entails the efforts of migrants and non-migrants coexisting in the hosting society.

Withing the INTEGRRA project, the collaboration of 4 organizations from Poland, Italy, Spain and Denmark working with immigrants aims at sharing knowledge, expertise and examples of good practice for dealing with the integration process through education.

## OBJECTIVES

The INTEGRRA project aims at providing a set of tools and training resources for building intercultural competences of immigrants and organizations working with people with migratory backgrounds. The main objectives are:

1- increasing the knowledge of partner organisations in the field of methods of integrating immigrants through learning about the methods used in other organisations;

2- building the foundations of an online learning environment targeted at the host community and immigrant.

## TARGET GROUPS

- immigrants, including asylum seekers and refugees living in a new host society
- adult educators, coaches and mentors, organizations working with immigrants, asylum seekers and refugees
- public authorities and volunteers involved in the integration process of migrants



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## MAIN RESULTS

- The “Different ways of Integration” e-guide to increase the knowledge of partner organizations, employees, volunteers and public representative working in the field of social inclusion with effective methods of carrying out activities integrating immigrants with the host community.
- An e-learning course formed by a set of Open Educational Resources (OERs) to support partner organizations and other adult educators working with people with migratory backgrounds.
- The 4 training modules are:
  - 1 – Cross-cultural Awareness
  - 2 – Understanding Different Cultures
  - 3 – Working with Stereotypes
  - 4 – Learning foreign languages in the host country: the most effective ways



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
